Road:

from North, South & West: take the M5 to junction 30. Turn onto the A3052 to Sidmouth and follow signs. Ignore first two right turns for Sidmouth but turn right towards Sidmouth onto A375. Follow this road for approximately 1 mile and turn right into Peaslands Road and take first left into Denby Terrace. Christian Guild gates and back entrance to hotel is opposite.

From East: At Honiton take A375 to Sidmouth for approximately 12 miles then follow directions from Sidmouth onto A375.

Rail: The nearest railway station to Sidmouth is Honiton on the Waterloo-Exeter line. Take 157 bus to Sidmouth (one every hour). Alternatively, use GWR services to Exeter St Davids, and bus to Exeter bus station, then take either the 9 or 9A bus (one every half hour) to Sidmouth.

The Brethren recognised only two ordinances—baptism and the Lord’s supper. As deeply committed activists, there were, however, a wide range of other aspects that were important in their practice of the Christian life.

There was conversion to Christ with which they held that every true Christian life began. There was the rich tradition of music and hymn singing in worship and evangelism, while evangelism itself—‘witnessing’—was given a central place in both assembly and individual lives. Marriage and the family also had salient importance in practising the faith and transmitting it to the next generation. Then there was the life of holiness and how it might be cultivated through private Bible study and prayer, and attendance at assembly gatherings and conferences. And there was an expectation that the assembly members had spiritual gifts that would be developed and used. All these elements (and more) of life in the Brethren movement are available for consideration at the conference.
